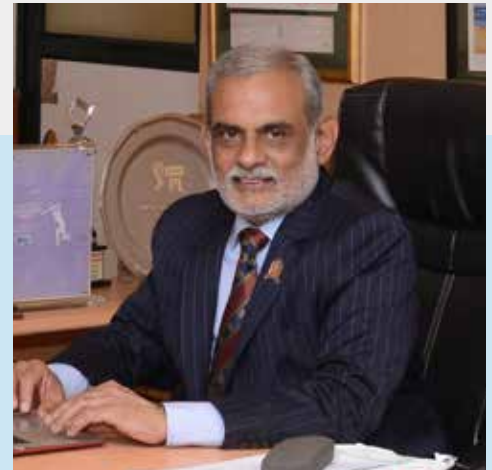

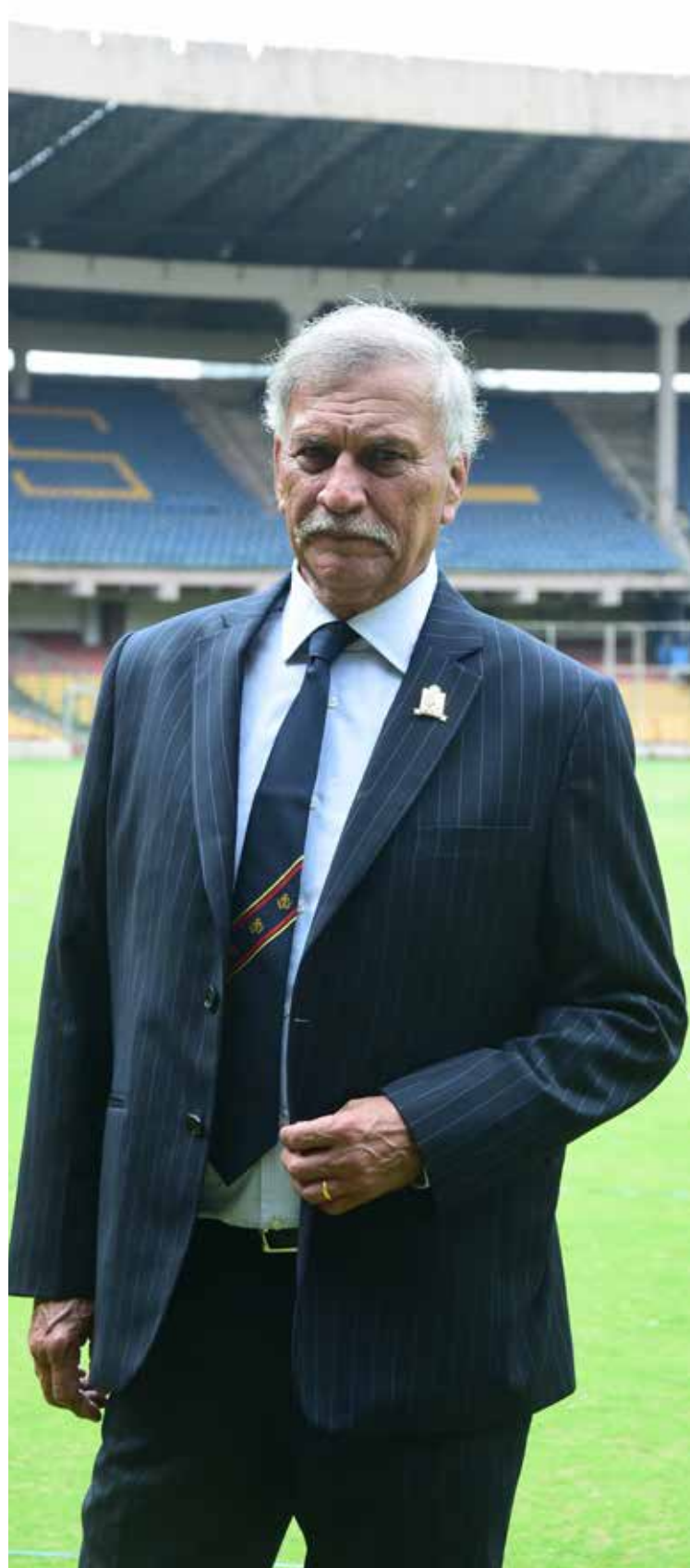

# MINUTES OF THE EIGHTY-THIRD ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING HELD ON SUNDAY, THE 31ST JANUARY, 2021 AT 10.30 AM

Eighty-third Annual General Body Meeting of the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA) was held on Sunday, the 31st January, 2021 at 10.30 am at the premises of M.Chinnaswamy Stadium, Cubbon Road, Bangalore – 560001.

1. Total Number of Members on Roll : 1919 (LM-1574 & IM – 345)
2. Quorum required as per Rules : 0100
3. Total Number of Members present : 0206
4. Meeting Notice sent to Members on : 8th January, 2021

The meeting commenced with the KSCA President, Mr. Roger M Binny, requesting all those present to maintain a minute's silence for the members of the Association who had lost their lives in the previous year.

He extended a warm welcome to all those present and hoped for their well-being.

The President explained that the delay in convening the meeting was a result of the pandemic. Since it was not desirable to hold the meeting virtually, the meeting had to be postponed till the present date.

Speaking of the performance of the teams in the previous year, the President stated that the Karnataka team won two championships the previous year, namely the Vijay Hazare and the Mushtaq Ali, but unfortunately lost in the semi finals of the Ranji Trophy.

He further stated that the Senior- and the U19 women's cricket teams qualified for the knockouts. But unfortunately the knockouts could not be held due to the pandemic.

Mr. Binny apprised the General Body that due to the pandemic, the development programs that were initially discussed had to be put on hold. Nonetheless, the Association is hopeful to make up for lost time once the pandemic-created situation allows.



On development projects, the President said that basic infrastructure for the grounds in Hubli and Belgaum has been created. The upcoming service centre in Alur is of good quality and the development of grounds in Raichur, Gadag, Hassan, Davangere, Coorg and Kolar is in the pipeline. Mysore and Mangalore have also been placed on high priority as there are a high number of young players hailing from there.

The Management also intends on restructuring the entire academy within the next two months.

Before handing the floor over to the Secretary, the President closed by highlighting some of the cricketing achievements of the past year. He congratulated the Senior Team on being the winners of the Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 Tournament and the Vijay Hazare Cup. He hoped that the state team would again achieve past successes of winning all major tournaments. He also stated that the Senior and the Under 19 Women's team did really well and qualified for the knockouts, which were not held owing to the onset of the pandemic.

He went on to highlight that the Association does have some elite representation on the BCCI referring to Ms. Shanta Rangaswami who is currently a member of the BCCI Apex Council. He further congratulated the former Secretary, Mr. Brijesh Patel who is now the IPL Chairman, for having organised the IPL in Dubai successfully. He recognised the efforts of Mr Rahul Dravid who is the Head of the National Cricket Academy, and Mr. Javagal Srinath who is an ICC match referee.

Further, he informed the members that Mr. Sunil Joshi has been nominated as a senior national selector (Men) and Ms. Kalpana Venkatachar has been nominated as senior national selector (Women).

Thereafter, Mr. Santosh Menon, Secretary KSCA, was requested by the President to take over the agenda.

Mr. Santosh Menon, Hon Secretary of KSCA, began by reading the Notice of the 83rd Annual General Meeting, which was being held on Sunday 31st, January, 2021 at 10:30 AM at the AGM hall of the Chinnaswamy Stadium, Cubbon road, Bangalore.

He informed all present that although item number 7 states that the appointment is to be ratified, it has been stated so erroneously and should read, "Approval of the appointment of an ethics officer".

Mr. Menon thanked all those present for braving the pandemic in participating in the Annual General Meeting. He stated that the meeting could not be conducted in the month of September and had to be delayed because of the pandemic.

The Secretary expressed heartfelt condolences on the demise of the former captain, former vice-president and the former BCCI curator Mr. Kasthuri Rangan, and former assistant secretaries Mr. S K Ramadhyani and Mr. Lachman Mehatani. He also regretfully stated that there were other



contributors and stakeholders who had lost their lives during the previous year and placed on record their contributions to the KSCA. He also conveyed the Association's desire to recognise Mr. Kasthuri Rangan's commitment towards the Association by holding a tournament in his name in the future.

Mr. Menon expressed praise for the members who are representing the KSCA in the BCCI, who are Ms. Shantha Rangaswami, currently an Apex Council member of the BCCI and Mr. Brijesh Patel, former Secretary of KSCA and presently the IPL Chairman. He further stated that had it not been for the IPL that Mr. Brijesh Patel had conducted single handedly, the Association would not have had any inflow of revenue at all.

Mr. Menon, like the President, congratulated Mr. Rahul Dravid whom he mentioned had been at the helm of affairs at the NCA and Mr. Javagal Srinath who is an ICC match referee. He also mentioned Mr. Sunil Joshi who is in the men's senior selection committee and Ms. Kalpana who is in the women's senior selection committee. He also informed all present that after the tenure of K Sriram as a South Zone curator, Mr. Prashant has taken over his role.

Speaking on representation of state players in Indian teams, he recognised KL Rahul, Mayank Agarwal and Manish Pandey as national regulars and said that the women's team has Veda Krishnamurthy and Rajeshwari Gaikwad, who plays for Railways but still, trained in Karnataka. Shubhang Hegde and Vidyadhart Patil who represented India in Under 19. Mr BR Sharath, captained the Indian Under 23 men's team against Bangladesh. Mr. Menon pointed out that Karnataka had the most number of players in IPL and the most number of umpires in the BCCI panel.

The Secretary then echoed the President's congratulations to the current achievements of the state cricket team for winning the Vijay Hazare trophy, Syed Mushtaq Ali trophy and being in the semi finals of the Ranji Trophy which they unfortunately lost. The senior women's and the Under 19 women's teams also qualified for the knockouts of their respective tournaments which weren't conducted because of the pandemic.

He then proceeded with briefing the meeting attendees on the achievements of the various state teams during the previous seasons.

In the U23 One-Day Tournament, Karnataka finished seventh in the league and in the C K Nayudu under 23 tournament, they finished sixth. In the Under 19 Vinoo Mankad, they lost in the quarter finals. And in the Under 19 Cooch Behar, they did not qualify for the knockouts. In the Under 16 tournament they qualified for the knockout and lost in the quarter finals. In the under 14 category they were South Zone champions.

In the women's senior category and the women's Under 19 categories, Karnataka qualified for the knockouts but due to the ongoing pandemic, the knockouts weren't held. They topped the group and lost the knockouts in the T20 tournament. In the Under 23 category they were placed sixth. In the Under 16 south zone category they were runners up.



Mr. Santosh Menon reiterated that although due to the pandemic, the KSCA was severely affected financially, it still extended as much charitable aid as it could. The Association contributed Rs. 50 lakh towards the Prime Minister's relief fund, through the BCCI and another Rs. 50 lakh towards the Chief Minister's relief fund. Moreover, he informed the General Body that the Association had maintained the stadiums at Bangalore and the zones during the pandemic and he applauded the groundsmen who were responsible for doing the same.

The Association had also provided the groundsmen with free essential rations and had ensured the timely payment of all their remuneration. Scholarships were also offered to meritorious cricketers whose families had been affected by the pandemic.

Support in terms of advances was extended towards the umpires and the scorers who were impacted by the pandemic. The subscription and cover charges for the KSCA Sports Centre members were dismissed. The guidelines with respect to Standard Operating Procedures were strictly followed at all times, in order to minimise the risk of contracting the virus.

With respect to the development of infrastructure, the Secretary then stated that the Chinnaswamy Stadium held top priority as there was a requirement to change the floodlights and the lattice structure. The Association has taken up this developmental project and hopes to have it completed before the next IPL. A spacious new dormitory for the catering staff has also been created so as to maintain the highest level of hygiene and ensure that they have a good living environment. The restroom facilities in the tennis section have also been renovated. Two lifts will be provided, one at the P2 level and the other at the C upper for the benefit of the spectators and the members during matches. For the social gatherings that are to be held for recreation, the renovation of the P terrace has also been initiated.

The KSCA would also be taking up the renovation pertaining to the residential rooms, the Garden Lounge, the player's dressing rooms, the Diamond Box, and the other half of the pavilion terrace and the health club followed by the relocation of the squash court.

He also spoke about the infrastructure development in other districts including Alur, Belgaum and Hubli which are nearing completion and assured the body that by the end of 2021, these projects would be completely functional. He further stated the Institute's intention of creating basic cricketing infrastructure at the lands that have been acquired in Hassan, Davanagere, Gadag, Coorg, Kolar and Raichur and those that will be acquired in Mangalore and Mysore.

The Secretary then informed the members that post-pandemic, as per information available to him, Karnataka was the first state in the entire country to have actively started playing cricket again. The KSCA initiated camps for Senior and Under 23 men's teams, and also conducted two tournaments - namely the YSR One-day tournament and the T20 tournament in Bangalore. The Under 23 inter mofussil, Under 23 inter zonal and the Under 19 interclub have been successfully undertaken since October 2020. He said that the zones have started completing their pending matches and would soon be starting their new seasons.



He then spoke about the workshops that the Association has been holding on an ongoing basis for the coaches, the umpires and the scorers. As part of a new initiative undertaken by the Association, workshops on mental toughness, media management, fame management, wealth management and general counseling would also be conducted for the cricketers. The Association is determined to frame a definite roadmap for cricketers, especially those who don't achieve the desired level of excellence, and strongly believes that these workshops would help educate the players in skills associated with the sport like management, coaching, physiotherapy training, umpiring, scoring, and video analysis amongst others.

He also stated that starting from April 2021, a full-fledged cricket season 2021-2022 is expected and that as always KSCA will maintain their position as the go-to Association of the BCCI. He reasoned that the KSCA is equipped with the right infrastructure, the expertise, and all other means and skills required to conduct tournaments. He highlighted the tournaments that had been successfully conducted last year, which included the Vijay Hazare and the Ranji Trophy for the seniors. Under 23, Under 19 and Under 16 matches and the women's matches were regularly conducted as well. He stated that they were hosted all across Karnataka.

The Secretary then announced the initiation of a new HR policy for the well-being of the entire workforce. A severance scheme has been introduced. Policies underlying all processes with respect to travel, leave allowance, bonus, appraisal and increment will be put in place to make the KSCA a policy-oriented workplace.

He acknowledged the approval granted by the General Body in the previous AGM with respect to discussion on inducting associates at Alur, Belgaum and Hubli. As finalised in the previous AGM, regular interactions with the tax and the legal experts are being held. A clear picture is likely to emerge in a few days and the matter would be taken forward based on the recommendations of the experts.

He stated that going forward a clear roadmap with respect to finances was expected to be outlaid. He also asserted that KSCA remains amongst the most transparent associations in the country when it comes to accounting policies and finance management and the Treasurer would present the entire report pertaining to the same.

He concluded by acknowledging the support of the sub committees concerned, and appreciating the support of the convenors and members who have been committedly contributing to the KSCA. He also assured the stakeholders of the Association that the Association endeavors to be mindful of all their needs and put in place the best practices and policies in order to maintain absolute transparency in the administration processes.

He reflected upon the support that each and every member had provided to the management over the last year and expressed his gratitude towards them all, while humbly seeking the same support and cooperation from the members to ensure that KSCA continues to be the best run association in the country along with the facilities of the M Chinnaswamy Stadium.



With that, the agenda was taken up.

Before taking up the items on the agenda and with a view to give a chance to all the members to express their views, the Secretary requested the members to be brief and to adhere to the agenda points.

Thereafter, the items on the agenda were taken up for discussions.

### **Item No.1**

#### **To confirm the minutes of the eighty-second Annual General Body Meeting held Sunday, the 1st March, 2020 at 10.30 am.**

The minutes of the Annual General Body Meeting held on 1st March, 2020 at 10.30 am as proposed by Shri. Raghuram Bhat, LM - 1049 and seconded by Shri. J. Praveen Kumar Singh representing Jaidur Cricketers, IM 150, was unanimously confirmed by the General Body.

### **Item No.2**

#### **To receive and adopt the Annual Report for the year 2019-20.**

The Annual Report for the year 2019-20 as proposed by Shri. B.K. Kumar, representing HAL Sports Club, IM 14 and seconded by Shri. Umamaheshwar, LM 1887 was unanimously adopted by the General Body.

### **Item No.3**

#### **To receive and adopt the Audited Statement of Accounts for the year 2019-20.**

The Chairman of the meeting invited Hon. Treasurer, Mr. Vinay Mruthyunjaya, to place the accounts before the General Body.

Mr. Vinay Mruthyunjaya, Hon.Treasurer started by acknowledging and appreciating the presence of Mr Roger Binny Hon. President and other Office Bearers, former Hon. Secretary and the current IPL Chairman Mr. Brijesh Patel, Former President Mr Ashok Anand, former Hon. Secretary Mr. Sudhakar Rao, former Treasurer Mr. Srinivasamurthy, former Vice-Presidents Mr. Jagannath and Mr. Puttakempanna, senior members, members from other districts, authorised representatives of Institutional Members and all others present. He greeted everyone by wishing them, though belated, a Happy New Year and he also conveyed his best wishes for the Makara Sankranti festivities.

He expressed his gratitude to all the Members for giving him an opportunity to serve as the Hon. Treasurer of KSCA. He recalled that during the last Annual General Meeting held on the 1st of March, 2020, he had informed the members on various activities and initiatives taken by KSCA and also about the financial situation of the Association.

The Hon. Treasurer said that due to the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic, the current year remained quite challenging as the economic activity across the globe had practically come to a



standstill and the KSCA was no exception. He added that he would prefer to focus on activities that would be undertaken in the ensuing months.

He echoed the sentiments of the Hon. President and the Hon. Secretary by expressing his gratitude to Mr. Brijesh Patel for providing the leadership to successfully organise the IPL in UAE. He informed the General Body that the KSCA had received an amount of Rs. 25 crore in December 2020 and reiterated that such an amount was received mainly due to the successful conduct of the recent IPL.

The Hon. Treasurer stressed that although the last General Body had approved an amount of Rs.80 crore for revenue expenditure and Rs.132 crore for capital expenditure for the FY 2020-21, immediately after the outbreak of the COVID pandemic, the Managing Committee had prepared a conservative revised budget to minimise the expenditure. Accordingly, a further revised budget wherein the revenue and capital budgets that was considerably downsized, was being presented to the General Body for ratification. He added that keeping in mind, the assurances made in the last General Body Meeting, the Management had ensured that, despite difficult circumstances, the bank balance would not fall below Rs. 25 crores. He further informed the members that the Management had ensured that the full salaries were paid to all the KSCA staff, even during the total lockdown period. The Treasurer said that in order to safeguard the existing cricketing infrastructure, the Association was obliged to incur considerable recurring expenditure towards maintenance of the cricket grounds and cricketing infrastructure, all though the cricketing activities had come to a standstill. He informed the members that, the bank balance as per the latest audited Balance Sheet presented to the General Body was Rs. 72.50 crore which was much larger than the Rs. 25 crore target minimum balance that had been stipulated by the General Body.

He also said that despite the financial constraints and other challenges, the Association magnanimously contributed Rs 50 lakh each to the Prime Minister's relief fund (through BCCI) and to the Karnataka Chief Minister's relief fund.

The Hon. Treasurer said that he was glad to inform the members that, as he was speaking, the bank balance stood at about Rs. 95 crore. He added that soon after the receipt of Rs. 25 crores from the BCCI in December, for the first time after several years, the KSCA bank account had hit a century and thus showed a balance of more than Rs.100 crore.

The Hon. Treasurer acknowledged that during the last AGM, some of the members had suggested that the weight of the AGM book should be reduced as it was difficult for senior members to carry it to the General Body meeting. He had kept the suggestion in mind and the AGM book for the current year had been split into two parts, one comprising the Annual Report and the other containing the Treasurer's report, Auditor's report, the audited Financial Statements, the significant accounting policies, the Notes to Accounts, cash flow, budgets and key financial



indicators. The Book No 2 also contained information pertaining to KSCA and the KSCA Gratuity Fund. To ensure transparency and to facilitate ease of understanding, the facts and figures had been tabulated and presented providing various comparisons. The Hon. Treasurer hoped that the members would appreciate such presentation including the graphical representation of the facts wherever appropriate.

Further, the Treasurer informed the General Body that although the KSCA had requested the members to seek clarifications in case of any queries with respect to the Audited Statements on or before the 23rd of January, 2021, no such queries had been received by the Association. However, the Treasurer assured the General Body that should there be any questions, clarifications could be sought after his address or even after the conclusion of the General Body meeting.

The Treasurer then drew attention to the cricketing season and the expenditure that ensued. He said that from the current year, the Association has undertaken a new initiative that Treasurer office has come up with frequently asked questions considering the figures of the current year which is significantly different from previous or earlier years and mentioned that these questions with answers were available in the Association's office and members would be welcome to have a look at it.

The Hon. Treasurer, further said that because of the uncertainty due to the pandemic and its impact on the economy, there were concerns about possible delays in the hosting of the international matches and the adverse impact on incomes. For these reasons, he said, the Association would proceed conservatively on spending. He pointed out that the decline in the prevailing interest rates also meant a consequent decline in the income of KSCA. Currently, as per the recommendations of the then Audit Committee, all the fixed deposits are being held in the State Bank of India but he said that the office bearers and the Managing Committee will explore more revenue generating options while ensuring the safety of the funds. The Treasurer assured the members that any such decision would be subject to the approval of the General Body.

The Treasurer then brought the attention of the General Body to the current status of uncertainty.

- He stated that there was no clarity or certainty, about the revenue inflows from the BCCI. This uncertainty meant there would be no clarity on the proportion of funds that would be allocated to the Association by the BCCI. Given the increase in the numbers of Associations, from 30 to 37, it is expected that there would be a change in funds allocation but the extent of this remains to be seen.
- He stressed that the financial transparency was a priority and assured the General Body that the procedures and processes implemented by the Association's former Office Bearers, with



respect to financial checks and disciplines, were being consistently followed. He said that all expenses exceeding Rs. 25 lakh were being posted on the website. Further, the Audited Accounts, prior to presentation to the General Body is first adopted by the Managing Committee, reviewed by the Finance Advisory Committee, the Accounts Review Committee and then it is recommended by the Audit Committee to the general body.

- The Hon. Treasurer said currently there were two different Internal Auditors viz., for KSCA and the KSCA Sports Centre. However, as all financial decision-making powers remained solely with the KSCA, the possibility of having a single Internal Auditor for both the KSCA and the Sports Centre, with additional Concurrent or Management Audit and have two separate auditors is being considered. He said that he believed this would lead to a rationalisation of many clerical, administrative and procedural aspects. He added that the Managing Committee would take a final decision.

Speaking about the measures proposed in the previous meetings to augment the finances of the Association, the Treasurer said that these initiatives could not be pursued in the preceding year. He stated that the revival of the plans to introduce the “M Chinnaswamy Stadium Tour”, along with a museum, is being considered. Since KSCA has a world class stadium with green initiatives, gate collections could be made from the visitors. Apart from that, he pointed out that all the convenors have been asked to procure some sponsorship at zonal level.

Before concluding, the Treasurer appreciated the accounts team, the independent auditors, the internal auditors and the audit and accounts related committee members for their efforts which helped ensure that the financial statements with closing entries were ready before end of June. The accounts were audited and completed by the month of July. He further stated that as on January 1st, 2021, the balance sheet for 31st December, 2020 stands closed and the half year Audit for the year 2021 was in progress.

He thanked the audit committee members and stated that the accounts placed before the General Body had the attention of about 40 chartered accountants, which included the statutory auditors, internal auditors, zonal auditors, fixed assets register auditor and the members of various sub committees.

The Hon. Treasurer then opened the floor for questions.

Mr. Shashidhar representing Shivamogga (IM-328) sought clarifications on the following issues:

- On page 69 of the Annual Report he wanted to seek clarification on why the budget was revised. He asked for a clarification pertaining to this revision.
- With regard to Page 60 of the Annual Report the property tax during the year 2016-17, the Association received a demand from the BBMP for Rs. 3.49 crore as property tax. He



appreciated the regular payment of the tax by KSCA but sought clarification on the status of the appeal pending with the courts.

- On Page 62 of the Annual Report capital commitment on various projects as of 31st March is Rs. 26.20 crore, whereas previously it was Rs. 34.93 crore. He pointed out that the reason for the difference hadn't been provided.
- He further stated that on page 30, there were IPL receipts in the year 2019, KSCA received a revenue of Rs. 5.47 crore, whereas in 2020 the same is reduced to Rs. 4.70 crores. He sought clarification for this reduction in revenue.
- He sought clarification on why pending Income Tax refund dues amounting to Rs. 63 crore have not been received yet.

Pointing to the Treasurer's address, Mr Ashok Raghavan representing Cavaliers Cricket Club, IM 58 complimented the Treasurer for the wonderful presentation of the accounts in the AGM Book and on his detailed address. Mr. Raghavan said that the presentation of the Accounts in the current year were much better than it was when he was a member of the Managing Committee.

Mr. Raghavan also pointed out that the Association did not have any inflow of money for two years because of the Lodha committee turbulence. He pointed out that since the Association did not receive any funds for those years a proper representation should be made to the BCCI.

Mr. Raghavan also sought clarification on why the Association would require permission from the members for the restructuring of the funds as deposits, because the byelaws state that the permission of the members is required for the allocation of funds towards fixed deposits and not for generation of income from the same.

The Hon Treasurer responded to the issues / queries raised by the members in the following manner:

Queries by Mr. Shashidhar:

- When the budget was initially prepared the pandemic had not been factored. The original budget had anticipated hosting some international matches at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium. The revised budget had become necessary in the new pandemic-influenced scenario.
- With regard to rates pertaining to the property tax, the Treasurer informed the General Body that the Corporation had levied a property tax of Rs. 3.64 crore assuming the utilisation of the stadium as a building. The Association had challenged the same by contesting that the open-air stadium had no roof and it could not be defined as a building. He said that per the KSCA's legal representatives he was hopeful that the Association would get a favourable order.



- With regard to the capital commitments, the Hon. Treasurer said that the amounts mentioned represented the cost of contracts for completion of projects. The break-up of the projects amount of Rs. 26.20 crores was as follows;

1. The projects at Alur, Belgaum and Hubli constitute Rs.25.87 crores.
2. The Raichur ground with Rs. 33 lakh

With regard to the decrease in revenue from the IPL matches, the Hon. Treasurer clarified that generally there will be seven IPL matches in a season played at M Chinnaswamy Stadium. However due to the early start of the twelfth edition of IPL there was one additional match during the financial Year 2018-19 and consequently there were only balance six matches held during the financial year 2019-20. Although the total income pertaining to each of the season continues to be the same.

On the question of pending income tax refunds, the Hon. Treasurer clarified that the amount shown in the Loans and Advances did not constitute immediate refunds nor those amounts expected to be received in the near future. He pointed out that the amounts are clearly mentioned as “Income tax disputed” in adjudication and appeals. He explained that since the year 2009-10 onwards, the income tax matters have been pending adjudication before the income tax authorities. He said that the Association, maintaining its policy of “pay and litigate”, will expeditiously pay all the taxes due and then await adjudication. Should the ruling be in favour of the Association, the Association would get back that amount with interest. However, should the ruling go against the Association, the Association would at least minimise the payments of additional interest and penalty.

Replying to Mr Ashok Raghavan representing Cavaliers Cricket Club, IM 58 queries Hon. Treasurer appreciated his concerns and suggestions on the distribution of finances of the BCCI, the Treasurer said that the Association had been making regular representations to BCCI.

The Treasurer said that the reason for seeking AGM approval in relation to the fixed deposits was not merely for keeping it in fixed deposits but to consider alternate but safe investments to generate higher returns than those available from fixed deposits. He said that the current bye laws prohibit the Association from investing funds anywhere other than in fixed deposits. He said that making alternate investments would need amendments to the bye- laws and that would require General Body approval.

There being no other queries for the Hon. Treasurer, the Accounts for the year 2019-20 proposed by Mr Jagannath, representing Select Cricketers, IM 174 and seconded by Mr Irfan Sait, representing Jawans Cricket Club, IM 166 were adopted.

The Secretary brought to the notice of the General Body that the Association was thankful to the State Government in particular for all the support that they had extended to the Association over the years.



#### **Item No.4**

##### **To ratify the appointment of Auditor/s for the year 2020-21.**

The continuation of appointment of A Upendra & Co., Chartered Accountants for the year 2018-19 was proposed by Mr. Siddharam, representing Caravan Cricket Club, IM163.

Mr. Ramamurthy, LM 76 opposed this proposal stating that it would be in the interest of the Association to change the auditors after a term of two years.

The Hon. Treasurer assured Mr. Ramamurthy, that while the current auditors are proficient in their dealings, for the matter of governance, his suggestion will be taken up with the Audit Committee.

Mr. Ramamurthy also stressed on the fact that the audit committee has only chartered accountants. He expressed his views which was that as there was no restriction in the bye laws of the Association, the members of the Association should also be part of the audit committee. The Treasurer replied that all the members of the audit committee were the members of the Association and most of them were, in fact, life members. Mr Ramamurthy expressed thanks for the clarifications.

#### **Item No.5**

##### **To consider any resolution, the Notice of which is given in writing to the Hon Secretary by a Member on or before the 13th day June, 2020 and considered eligible to be placed in the General Meeting by the Managing Committee.**

The General Body was informed that no resolution was received and the same was noted.

#### **Item No.6**

##### **To ratify the Revised Capital and Revised Revenue Budget for the year 2020-21 and to approve the Capital Budget and Revenue Budget for the year 2021-22.**

With regard to capital expenditure budget, the capital and revenue budgets for the year 2020-21 along with capital and revenue budget as proposed by Mr D.S.Sathyadeep (LM-2167) and seconded by Mr S.P.Mahaboob (IM-52) were unanimously approved by the General Body.

#### **Item No.7**

##### **To approve the appointment (till the conclusion of the next General Body Meeting) of Ethics Officer and Ombudsman Justice (Retd.) Mr KN Keshava Narayan, Retired High Court Judge.**

The Secretary stated that as pointed out earlier, this agenda item should be read as “to approve” and not as “to ratify”.



The appointment (till the conclusion of the next General Body Meeting) of ethics officer and Ombudsman - Justice (Retd.) Mr KN Keshava Narayan, retired High Court Judge as proposed by Ms. Shantha Rangaswamy, LM 2183 and seconded by Shri. Ramesh Chug, LM 1117 was unanimously approved by the General Body.

### **Item No.8**

#### **To consider the recommendations of the Managing Committee in accordance with Rule 86.**

The Secretary informed the members present that the following were the recommendations of the Managing Committee:-

- **Membership issues:-** Transfer of membership which is beyond two years.
- **Amendments to Sports Centre byelaws:-** Changes with respect to Sports Centre byelaws which were necessary due to a few ambiguities.
- **Approval of additional budget for the phase-two project at Alur:-** With regard to the on-going Alur project, the Special General Body held in 2015 had approved Rs.33 crores for the said project. Alur has now become one of the most sought after centres in the country to host various BCCI and India-A matches. In fact, Alur has already hosted the Ranji Trophy, Vijay Hazare, Syed Mushtaq Ali tournament, India-A series against Australia and South Africa. On review of the on-going project and new additions necessitated an additional budget of Rs.13 crores.

He requested the General Body for their approval.

With the above, all the above recommendations as proposed by Shri. Sailesh Poll, LM 2126 and seconded by Shri. A.V. Shashidara, representing City Cricketers, IM 3 was unanimously approved by the General Body.

### **Item No.9**

#### **To transact other business of formal or important nature as may be allowed by the Chairman.**

- Addressing all present, Mr. RS Prasad (IM244) representing Magadi Cricket Club, spoke about the Club House membership given to the playing teams in the league and enquired if another membership of the president or secretary could be allotted.

He also pointed out that the expenses for running cricket clubs especially in divisions IV and V, have constantly been on the rise. He thereby suggested a rise in the remuneration of allowance and an increase in the division IV, number of matches from five to seven.



- Mr Rajshekhar representing Cosmos Cricket Club, Raichur, IM 321 informed all present that the Government had proposed allocating 20 acres of land in Gulbarga and requested to pursue the same. He also expressed concern about the lack of a Convenor for the Raichur Zone and also requested that the matter be looked into.
- Greeting all present and wishing everyone a happy Makar Sankranti, Mr. K Sethu Madhav Rao representing Jaya Vijaya Sports Club, IM 217 pointed out that the Secretary in the General Body Meeting had been requested to call upon a meeting in the Raichur zone. Although the Secretary agreed with the same, it could not be held due to the Covid-19 pandemic. However, he requested the Secretary to convene a meeting of all clubs in Raichur Zone at the earliest. He also requested the management to ensure that cricketing activities are not hampered in the zone. He requested the management to nominate a Chairman at the earliest in the absence of Convenor.
- Mr. Kushal Patil representing Gajanana Cricket Club, IM 291 was of the view that more meetings should have been conducted in the Raichur zone. He also affirmed that the members should be made aware of the people in charge of each zone along with the activities that are being undertaken in the Bidar zone.
- Congratulating the managing committee, Mr. M.S. Keshava representing the Royal Cricket Club (IM-155) brought the attention of the dais to the badminton and the tennis courts. He stated that whenever there was IPL or KPL being held, these courts were shut down and this created an inconvenience.
- Mr. Alston Bell, representing All India Anglo Indian Cricket Club (IM88) felt that an ambulance should be parked outside the pitch of every match that was taking place. He expressed his concern over the safety of the players.
- Mr Sriram Kasturi thanked the Association for honouring his late father.
- Dr. A Shomeshekar representing Secretariat Cricket Club IM 130 congratulated the entire team and thanked the Association for managing and holding activities amidst the on-going financial crisis.
- Mr. Shrikanth representing the Hemavathi Cricket Club Sakleshpur (IM-261) requested the Association to provide kits to rural cricket clubs at subsidised rates. He stated that the convener in the Shivamogga zone had funded the kit on his own and thereby requested the Association to consider providing cricket kits to cricket playing clubs in the zone. He further urged the Association to provide a seminar on spin pitch and fast pitching to these players. He also thanked the Association for providing M1 and M2 tickets for spouses and children. He informed all present that they come after travelling 200-300km from Sakleshpur, Hassan, Bhadravathi and Raichur and end up paying Rs. 1,350 as the room rent. He urged the Association to make it a nominal amount of Rs.1000.



He also brought to the notice of all present that they had made an urgent cement pitch for practice and spent between Rs 40,000 and Rs 50,000 on this pitch. He said that the Association should reimburse the same.

He stated that they had been established for the last 50 years, since 1975, and required help as of today. The players were finding it difficult to play for a mere Rs 10,000 to Rs 20,000. He said that games like badminton and tennis were also being played in the cricket stadium but more assistance ought not to be given to cricket.

**The President / Hon.Treasurer / Hon.Secretary replied to the issues / queries raised by the members in the following manner:-**

- Replying to Mr. RS Prasad, the Secretary informed that the same agenda item was discussed in the previous meeting and it was decided that one more membership in Alur, Shivamogga, Hubli, Belgaum (depending on the club) would be allotted.
- Further he stated that his suggestion pertaining to the increase in the allowance of the playing clubs and increase in the number of matches in Division IV would be discussed in the cricket committee or the tournament committee comprising umpires, former cricketers, and club secretaries.
- The Secretary explained to Mr. Rajashekhar that the delay in the proceedings with regard to the Raichur zone convenor could not be the fault of the KSCA as it is a sub judice matter and the legal procedure needs to be followed.
- He further assured Mr. Rajashekhar that the Association does not differentiate between zones and has appointed the Joint Secretary who will hold charge of the operations of the Raichur zone.
- With regard to Mr K Sethumadhava Rao's remarks, the Secretary informed that given the size of the Raichur zone many administrative problems are being faced. He further stated that committees are in place and meetings are being conducted.
- He also assured Mr. K Sethumadhava that all his queries can be addressed anytime in the Association's office and all information that he requires would be handed over to him.
- The views of Mr. Kushal Patil were noted and it was informed to him that there is one person who is in charge of all the zones in Bangalore who coordinates the activities between all the zones.
- It was further stated that should Mr. Kushal still face problems, he was welcome to visit the office of the Association which would then look at viable solutions.
- Mr. Keshav was advised to bring this issue up in the AGM of the Sports Centre. Further, it



was explained to him that in order to facilitate the ease of conducting the IPL and the KPL such courts needed to be closed. However, the project at Alur should be able to resolve this matter and the courts will remain functionable there even when the matches are going on.

- Mr. Alston Bell's suggestion was taken into account and he was informed that although there may be practical difficulties in parking an ambulance for all the matches that take place, given that 5000 matches take place across the state of Karnataka, a first aid kit has been provided to every team. Nonetheless, the Association agrees with him and will look at alternate solution.
- Mr. Shrikhant was informed that according to the bye laws, the 4M clause, the Association cannot give or reimburse money directly to clubs or life members. However, acknowledging his difficulties, he was informed that the balls and practice facilities have already been provided. The Association has taken many initiatives towards improvement and has started providing travelling allowance to players travelling between districts. Children's tickets and spouse tickets for international and IPL matches will be provided to club secretaries.

Showing gratitude towards the Government for all their support the Association unanimously approved the granting of the honorary membership to Mr. Vijendra, Mr. Yeddyurappa's son.

On behalf of the Committee, the President thanked each and everyone for attending the meeting. He once again informed that healthy discussions and inclusive participation of members with regard to all aspects for the smooth functioning of the Association were always welcome.

# WE'RE BACK IN THE SERIOUS BUSINESS OF CRICKET

**As cricket resumed at all levels, happy faces were visible everywhere. The players were happy to return to action and so were the administrators and office-bearers to resume their duties**

**Dear Members:**

It gives me great pleasure to greet you all amid so much positivity, thanks to the fading fears of the pandemic. It is indeed a time to celebrate.

And the KSCA has all the more reason to do so with cricket action resuming at all levels and all venues buzzing with activity. Players, office-bearers and administrators are all back and busy, happy and positive, and very eager to get down to doing some serious business of cricket.

The past year has not been as satisfying as we had hoped for

as the pandemic fears persisted and with it the lockdowns and restrictions were prolonged. But as the second wave abated and the state government eased restrictions, the KSCA was quick to grasp the opportunity and put bat to ball.

Slowly but steadily, cricketers were allowed to practice under strict protocols. Every guideline set by the state government were followed duly and diligently and, as a result, the players as well as the administrators and officials took to the field with increasing confidence.







As cricket resumed at all levels, happy faces were visible everywhere. The players were happy to return to action and so were the administrators and office-bearers to resume their duties.

The Elite Group A matches of the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy Twenty-20 Tournament was conducted in Bangalore. All matches were played at the Alur grounds from January 10 to 18, 2021. The group consisted of Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, Tripura, Railways, Uttar Pradesh and hosts Karnataka.

All safety precautions were taken and a suitable environment created for the smooth conduct of the event. That not a single positive case was detected speaks volumes of the enormous efforts put in by everyone concerned.

The Elite Group C matches of 50-overs Vijay Hazare Trophy were followed at the Bangalore and Alur grounds from February 20 to 28, 2021. The group consisted of Kerala, Bihar, Railways, Uttar Pradesh, Odisha and hosts Karnataka.

Again, much to the joy of everyone concerned, the tournament was a roaring success and drew appreciation from players and officials of not only the participating teams but also the BCCI officials, a few even watched some matches.



The KSCA were allotted the Plate Group matches of the Senior Women's One-Day Tournament. Again, we were quick to grasp the opportunity and rose to the occasion in typical style. All the matches were played at the Alur grounds from January 11 to 21, 2021. The group consisted of Jammu and Kashmir, Pondicherry, Mizoram, Bihar, Manipur, Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh.

The performance of our teams was satisfying as they reached the knock-out stages in all the three tournaments.

The eagerly-awaited Indian Premier League was to begin as scheduled with 10 matches to be held in Bangalore from May 9 to 22, 2021. The KSCA, as usual, began preparations on a war footing. Unfortunately, there was a breach in the bio-bubble of a few IPL teams at other centres and the IPL governing council had no option but to abandon the event midway, much to the despair of millions of cricket lovers and our very own Brijesh Patel, the chairman of IPL.

By successfully hosting the IPL matches, the KSCA was looking forward to proving our ability and acumen to conduct top class matches even against adversity of pandemic proportions. Unfortunately, that was not to be as the IPL was moved to the United Arab Emirates.

Off the field too, we did an admirable job in developing and expanding existing infrastructure, strengthening and refurbishing old structures and introducing new aspects to enhance the watching experience of spectators, like for example, setting up the unique Unipole High-Mast Floodlight Towers which was inaugurated by our Hon'ble Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai.

The KSCA has always had cricket and cricketers at the heart of its growth and development. As a result, the KSCA is today recognised as the best-run Association by the BCCI and duly rewarded.

Karnataka is the only State in the country which has more than 12 first -class venues. We have stadiums in Mysore, Shivammoga, Hubli, Belgaum, apart from six venues in Bangalore. We regularly host India 'A' and domestic matches, India men's and women's senior team camps, India under-19 camps and so on. This highlights the strong infrastructure that is in place in our State.

We are in the process of building fully equipped stadiums in Raichur, Davanagere, Gadag, Hassan, Kolar and Coorg. We've taken the first step in this regard by acquiring land in all these places. Our vision is to have good infrastructure in each district of Karnataka.

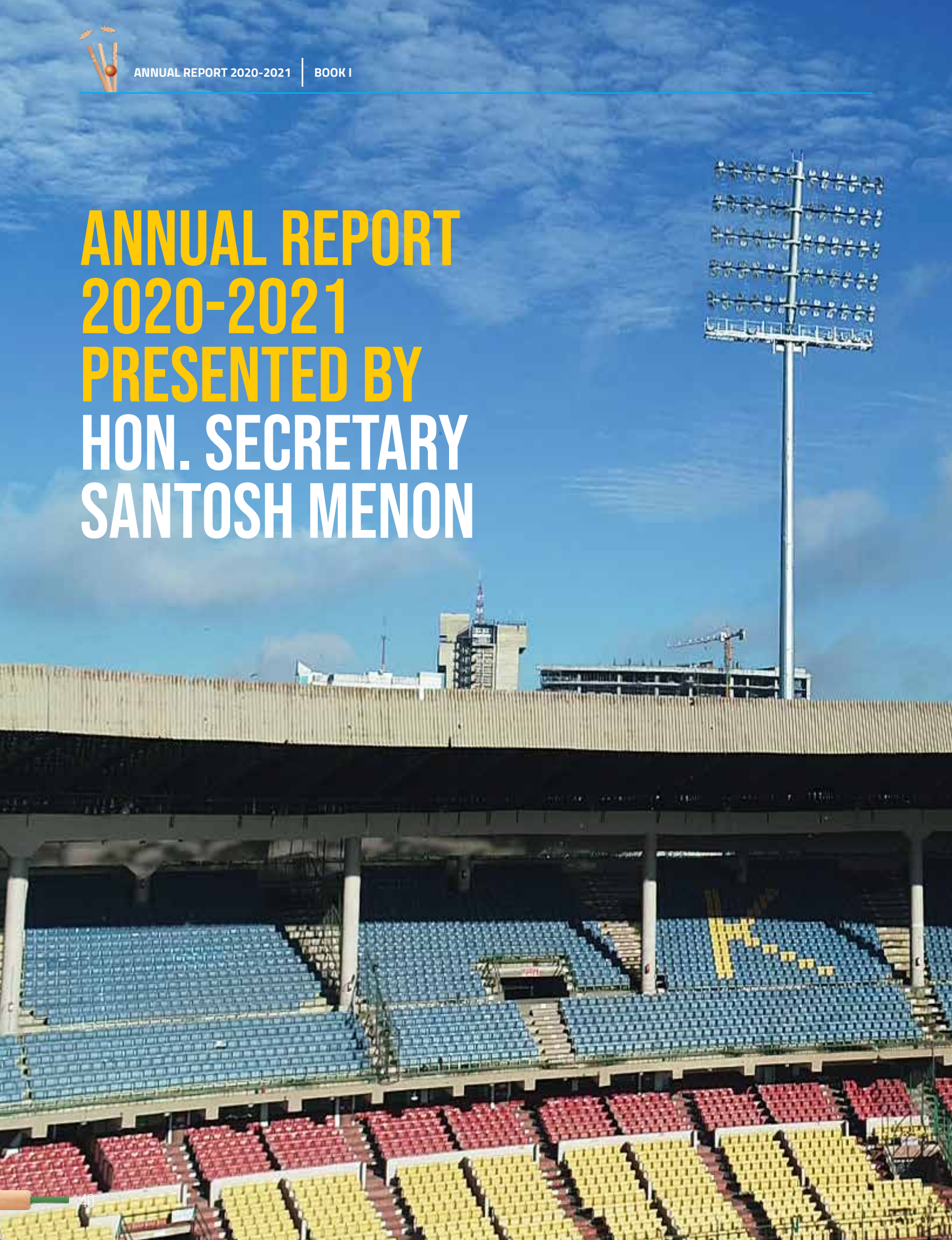

## SENIOR MEN

The Elite Group A matches of the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy (Twenty-20) Tournament was conducted in Bangalore. All matches were played at the Alur grounds from January 10 to 18, 2021. The group consisted of Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, Tripura, Railways, Uttar Pradesh and hosts Karnataka. All safety precautions were taken and a suitable environment created for the smooth conduct of the event.

Most of the teams stayed close to the venue at Alur and elaborately planned transport and transit arrangements ensured that everyone involved with the game on and off the field were protected against the virus. That not a single positive case was detected speaks volumes of the enormous efforts put in by everyone concerned.

This tournament was almost seamlessly followed by the (50-overs) Vijay Hazare Trophy. The Elite Group C matches were conducted at the Bangalore and Alur grounds from February 20 to 28, 2021. The group consisted of Kerala, Bihar, Railways, Uttar Pradesh, Odisha and hosts Karnataka.

Again, the KSCA were quick to grasp the opportunity and rose to the occasion in typical style. All the matches were played at the Alur grounds from March 11 to 21, 2021. The group consisted of Jammu and Kashmir, Pondicherry, Mizoram, Bihar, Manipur, Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh.

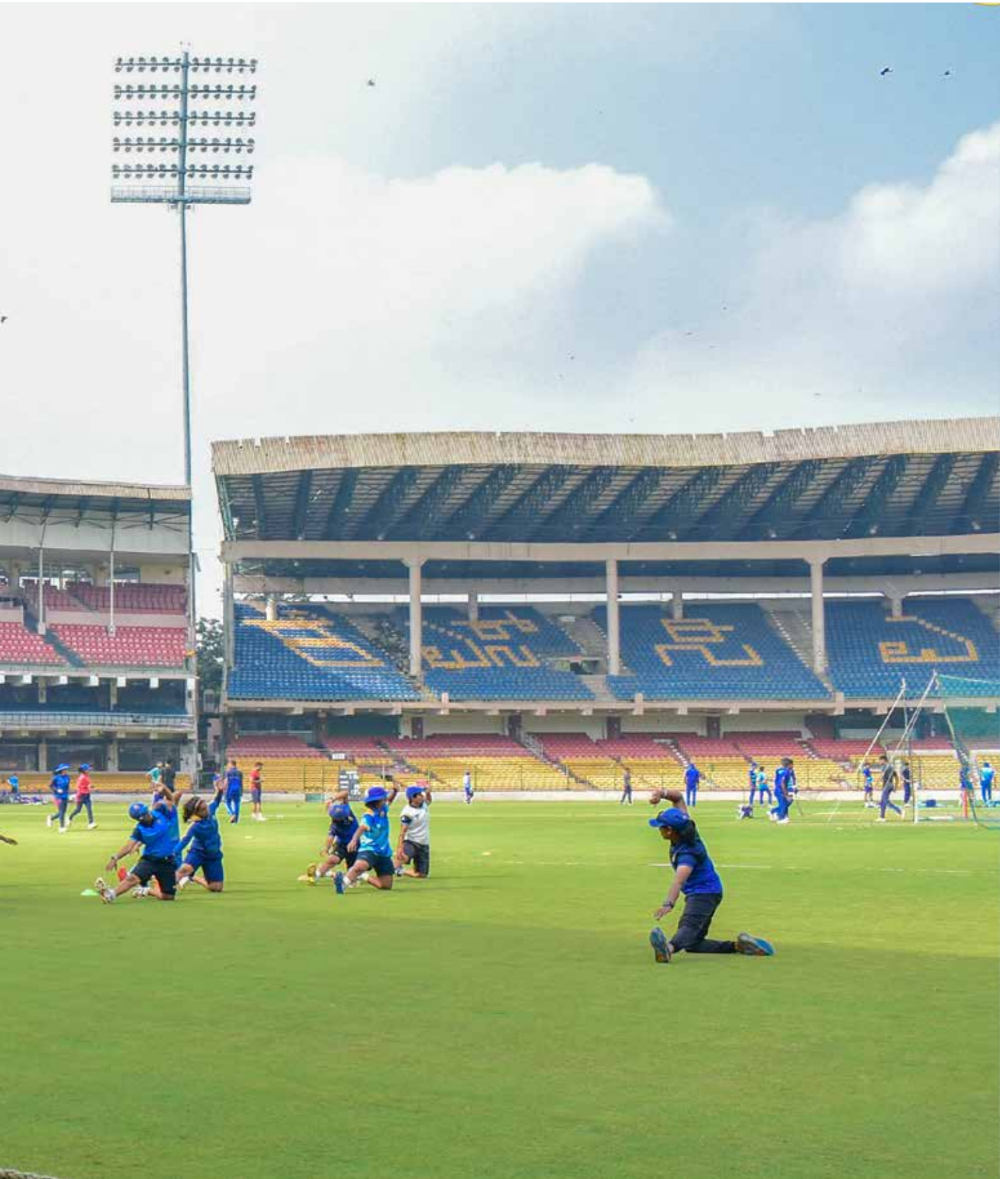
## CONDUCT OF IPL

# ZONAL REPORTS

## BANGALORE ZONE

The raging COVID-19 pandemic in Bangalore City saw the state government impose a strict lockdown. Naturally, all cricket activities came to a standstill as the health and safety of our players, coaches, umpires, scorers, staff, etc was of paramount importance.

We had all COVID-19 protocols in place at the Chinnaswamy Stadium and all other venues. And as the months went by and the covid cases reduced, curbs were lifted and eventually sports was given the green signal to resume.

By then we had made all arrangements at all our venues to kickstart the game. As soon as the state and central governments and the BCCI waved the green flag, we got going in right earnest.

The KSCA conducted only a few tournaments as the start of the season was delayed for reasons mentioned above. The tournaments were organised in accordance with the BCCI's national schedules. Our players were fit and raring to launch Karnataka's challenge.

The response was tremendous with most of our clubs keen to participate. Matches were organised at various venues for speedy completion and everything went on like clockwork, pandemic or no pandemic.





The tournaments that we managed to organise without any hiccups were as follows:

## Y S RAMASWAMY MEMORIAL TOURNAMENT



Starved of cricketing activity, a total of 133 Bangalore-based clubs were in the fray in the tournament which was organised at 20 grounds across the city. This had to be done to complete approximately 118 matches in a 17-day window. The tournament kicked off with the knockout format and eight teams qualified for the Super League. Last season's quarter-finalists were added to the Super League and the 16 teams were divided into four groups. The teams played in round - robin format and the top two teams from each group advanced to the knockouts. The final was held on December 14, 2020 at the M. Chinnaswamy Stadium.

# MYSORE ZONE

# TUMKUR ZONE

# RAICHUR ZONE

This zone consists of seven districts - Raichur, Yadgir, Kalburgi, Bidar, Koppal, Vijayapur and Bagalkot

As per the instructions from the KSCA, Bangalore, following the COVID-19 pandemic-induced restrictions and lockdowns, cricket activities in Raichur and surrounding districts came to a standstill from April, 2020. # A HUMAN-TOUCH TO KSCA'S HR POLICY

The KSCA management has taken the initiative to strengthen the Human Resources policies and systems. The intent is to give clarity to the employees about the Standard Operating Procedure of the KSCA, communicate to the employees on their benefits and create a culture of transparency and discipline.

In this endeavour, employee-friendly HR policies are created and communicated to the employees.

The KSCA also believes in recognising the performances of its employees. To foster this culture, we have formulated a well-defined performance appraisal matrix to assess the performance of the employees. This will ensure that good performers are compensated adequately and a performance driven culture is developed.

The management has paid ex-gratia to the employees which is equivalent to one-month's salary.

All employees are brought under the umbrella of nine grades and designations. Each designation has a minimum and maximum salary band and every employee fits into one of these grades. This will help parity of salary to all employees.

The pay band of employees has been reformulated based on experience, tenure and designation. With this, the monthly increase in the payout is around Rs. 6 Lakh. This makes a

direct and positive impact on the KSCA employees take home package.

The KSCA employees are now witnessing a clearly defined and transparent policy and parity in the job roles

matching their salary. Our endeavour is to continuously improve our HR policies to meet the requirements of the Association benefits the employees and provide them a defined career path.





## ADMINISTRATIVE MEASURES

The KSCA, despite the financial problems, thanks to the pandemic, has enhanced the fees payable to the umpires and scorers who perform their duties in organising cricket matches at all levels. The allowances provided for lunch has also been marginally increased along with ground rent as well.

The Karnataka State Cricket Association played a pro-active role in helping the central and state health authorities in combating the Covid-19 pandemic. The KSCA donated Rs50 lakh each to the central and state governments to augment their resources in the fight against the pandemic.

The KSCA has been working closely with the Government of Karnataka and other state health regulatory bodies and the police to provide all possible support.

The KSCA made available its grounds to establish Covid Care Centres. The State police were provided accommodation wherever needed free of cost in the KSCA premises and other venues.

Apart from that, the KSCA paid the salaries in full and provided other necessary financial benefits to the administrative and ground staff.

All Covid-19 protocols have been observed at all the activities of the KSCA and they continue to be in place even today as the pandemic is yet to reach the endemic stage. The KSCA is committed and duty bound to protect all players, coaches, staff etc. as also the general public to the extent possible at all times, pandemic or no pandemic.

**The state-of-the-art Unipole High-Mast Floodlight Towers make cricket watching more pleasing aesthetically and richer and brighter as it avoids glare and sheds uniform light across the playing area**

Marching with the changing times, the KSCA recently modernised its floodlights system by installing the state-of-the-art Unipole High-Mast Floodlight Towers. So, the next time we watch a cricket match under lights at the iconic M Chinnaswamy Stadium, the experience will be all the more pleasing aesthetically and richer and brighter.

The new generation lighting system provides much higher lumens (intensity) of light which will be uniform across the playing area. It also avoids glare so that the viewing experience for players, match officials and spectators will be enhanced and enticing.

The revamped towers were switched on by Sri Basavaraj Bommai, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Karnataka, on the auspicious evening of the Swarna Gowri Pooja day on September 9, 2021.

"I have witnessed the growth of the Chinnaswamy Stadium from 1974 onwards when the first Test match between India and the West Indies was played," the CM recalled during the unique ceremony.

## THE SALIENT FEATURES OF THE REVAMPED FLOOD LIGHTING SYSTEM:

Replacement of the 25-year-old lattice type structures with new polygonal continuously tapering stadium masts with fixed head frame

- a) The design of the stadium mast has been done keeping in view future provision of replacement of old conventional flood light fixtures with modern generation high power LED flood lights. Whenever the replacement of conventional fixtures with LED flood light is planned, the KSCA will only have to replace the existing fixtures with new LED flood lights without any change in the system.
- b) All old cables and switchgears have been replaced with new with a view to enhance the system life as well as readiness for future upgradation to LED flood lights.
- c) In view of the acute space constraint, it was really challenging to install the new stadium masts each of around 65m height

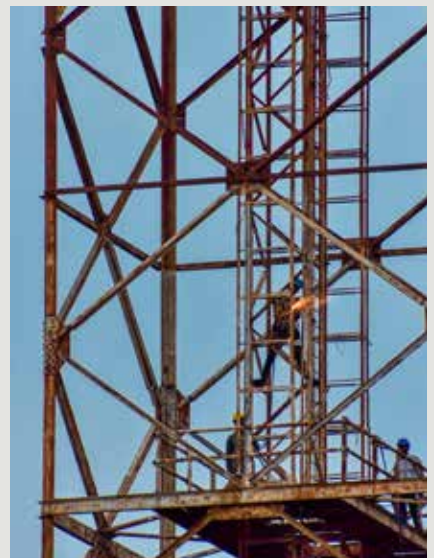
- Long life of around 50,000 burning hours as compared to 3,000 burning hours for conventional metal halide lamps resulting in huge reduction in maintenance cost.
- Possibility of dimming the floodlights for lower lighting levels for events other than cricket matches.
- Possibility of creation of different lighting scenes using DMX control system for LED flood lights.

and weighing almost 30 tons. It was not possible to adopt the conventional method of assembling the complete tower horizontally on ground level and erect the same on foundations since it would have involved a very heavy crane for which enough space was not available at the site. The executing agency, M/s Transrail Lighting Limited adopted a novel method of vertical assembly wherein each section of the mast was installed vertically using smaller capacity crane. This method called for precision working to ensure proper alignment and stress fitting of sections in vertical position. In spite of many challenges, the installation of all four masts was completed in record time of 30 days.

- d) The 2kW metal halide floodlights were installed and precision aiming of the flood lights was carried out as per illumination design. The lighting parameters were measured and found to be fully conforming to the latest guidelines as per International Cricket Council.
- e) The new system has been installed at an approximate cost of around Rs.4.8 crores and the project was completed within six months.

## ALUR CRICKET GROUND



The Construction of Phase 2 project was undertaken in earnest and the construction of the building work is completed while the finishing part of the works is in progress. Of the proposed interior work, the Mock up room has been completed.

Excavation work is in progress for the erection of a safety netting around the venue.

### **Alur Ground No. 4:**

At the Alur Ground No 4, a total of five pitches, have been completed while 60% of outfield work is also over and leveling of red soil has also been completed. While the sight screen No. 1 block work has been completed, the plastering work is in progress while sight screen No. 2, nearly 70% work has been completed.

The construction of the sump tank has been completed and water proofing work is going on and will be completed soon.

The construction of the pump house has been completed and plastering work is in progress and 65% of the work towards construction of the drain has been completed. With regard to the sprinkler system, the laying of the pipeline has been completed.

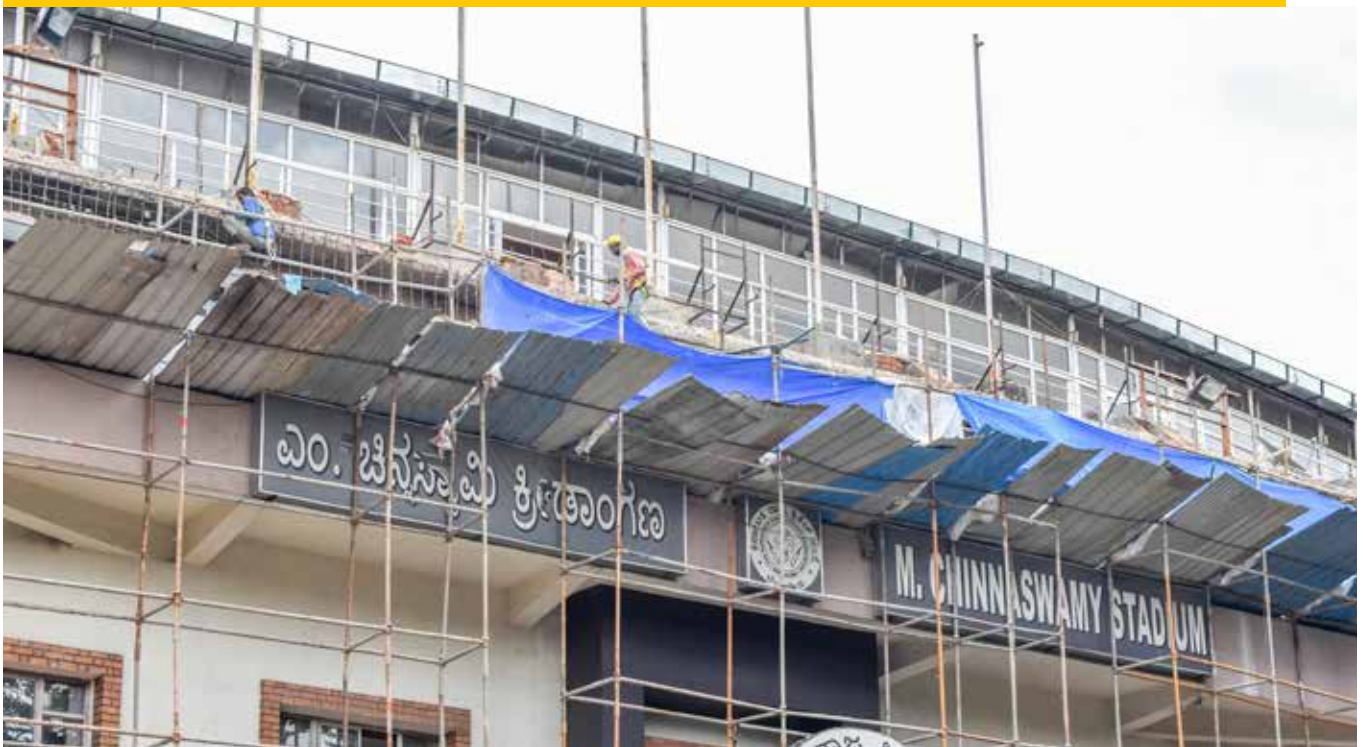

# RAISING THE COMFORT ZONE

The KSCA continues its relentless push towards enhancing the comfort levels for its members, both during match days and non-match days, by constantly upgrading all its facilities across the spectrum of the stadium – right from the kitchens to the viewing areas. The following are the present works in progress and the plans for the future

## STRUCTURAL STRENGTHENING AND LEAKAGE RECTIFICATION



A comprehensive and detailed report on the structurally distressed areas and leakage affected portions at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium has been prepared. Jobs are prioritised based on the structural criticality and works commenced. All the structurally distressed areas are being strengthened and structural rehabilitation undertaken which involves determining the origin of distress, removing damaged materials as well as selecting and applying appropriate repair materials that will extend the structure's life.



## SERVICE LIFT AND PANTRY EXTENSION



To ensure speedy service for the hospitality areas of P2 , P Terrace and J Corporate during matches, a separate lift is being installed for the catering staff. A separate pathway from the service lift to the hospitality areas are also coming up. This would reduce inconvenience to members and guests during matches as the service staff movements will be through a separate lift .

## RENOVATION OF RESIDENTIAL ROOMS

The residential rooms are being renovated to make these neat, hygienic and luxurious. Ms Mandala Architects have been engaged for the project and they have already given a detailed presentation of their proposed plans. Budgetary approvals have been accorded by the Managing Committee and the work will be starting soon.

## RENOVATIONS OF GARDEN LOUNGE

In order to enhance the ambience of the garden lounge, architects have been appointed to improve the interiors of the restaurant hospitality lounge, garden lounge furniture, electrical works and IT works.



## P TERRACE RENOVATION



With a view to provide world class, high-end hospitality to our spectators in the Terrace Stand and to create additional space for organising parties during non-match days, the eight terrace rooms have been demolished and the space remodeled into a dedicated buffet and bar section and a green room.



## SEPARATE HIGH-PERFORMANCE GYM FOR CRICKETERS



The existing gym is being used by members as well as cricket players leading to overcrowding. To rectify the situation so that members and players can enjoy their time at the gym without having to wait for their turn to use their favourite equipment, a separate high performance gym exclusively for the players is being set up using the existing E-Executive hospitality area.

## TERRACE HOSPITALITY STAND



### Renovations of kitchens (veg and non-veg)

Plans are on to upgrade the kitchens to suit modern requirements with separate vegetarian and non-vegetarian sections to ensure hygiene, cleanliness and easy maintenance. Mr Pramod Paleri of SMP Associates has been engaged as consultant and he has given a detailed presentation keeping the modern requirements in mind. The vegetarian and non-vegetarian sections have been specifically demarcated. Budgetary approvals have been accorded by the Managing Committee, tenders have been floated and the work to be started soon.

## Fire Hydrant pipelines system

Fire hydrant pipelines at the main ground of M. Chinnaswamy Stadium were installed in 1997 as a mandatory requirement from the fire department.

A new fire hydrant system has been installed at a cost of more than Rs. 40lakhs which is now ready for use.

## PLANS IN THE OFFING

### Changing of roof in the entire western stand

Install roof top solar panels in the western stand to augment the solar power generation. In this regard, it is proposed to change the existing roof sheets of the western stand. This would also prevent rain water seepage which is a problem right now due to damaged roof sheets.





## DREAM PROJECT

### Setting up of a museum

The iconic M Chinnaswamy Stadium is a treasure trove of memorabilia, including photographs, trophies, documents and various other items connected to cricket and cricketers. They have been meticulously collected and methodically maintained over several decades.

In recent times, there has been considerable interest among the connoisseurs of cricket as well as the common man and cricketers themselves to see these artifacts.

Therefore, the KSCA is planning to build a cricket museum which can become a tourist spot and attract not only cricket lovers in particular but also the general public who visit nearby tourist spots like Vidhana Soudha and Cubbon Park.

#### Further plans including:

- Conducting guided tours of the museum, hold interactive sessions between the public and the cricketers, and create a special section for playing virtual cricket.
- Merchandising cricket items, like T-shirts, caps, scarfs, water bottles and other paraphernalia. This is a major public relations exercise the KSCA is planning with the aim to generate revenue.

The above proposal has been approved by the KSCA Managing Committee and a space of around 3,000 sq.ft. at the old Land Army office area has been earmarked which can be further extended by another 1,000 sq.ft.

A few interested museum curators and planners have studied the data and space available and given their presentations. The KSCA was in the processing of short-listing prospective proposals when COVID restrictions and lockdowns kicked in.

It is now proposed to kickstart the project and complete the same in quick time subject to availability of adequate funds for the same.

### Diamond Box renovation

The Diamond Box is the most important hospitality area of the KSCA where a large number of VIPs, BCCI and ICC dignitaries, are invited to witness matches. It is also a spacious party area within the premises during non-match days.

As such, the Diamond Box requires renovation, including modification of toilets. Also, a suitable passenger elevator needs to be installed to facilitate the movement of elderly people (there is an old lift which is mainly used by the catering staff).

### Health Club upgradation

Upgrade the existing health club to bring it on par with world class facilities with state-of-the-art interiors and modern equipment.

### Relocation of squash court

Construct a new squash court on par with international standards with a good viewing gallery and upgrade the changing rooms and toilets located in the vicinity of the new synthetic surfaced tennis court.

### P Terrace II phase renovation

In the second phase, the balance six terrace rooms have been demolished and remodeling work will start shortly to convert it into top class party areas to augment the already renovated areas.

The KSCA Sports Centre successfully battled through the pandemic to keep its premises and facilities in top shape; and once the lockdown was lifted it was back to business

The KSCA Sports Centre is a beehive of activities and the nerve centre for all its members during normal times. But due to the COVID pandemic, most of its facilities had to be shut.

After a prolonged and painful period of inactivity, there was a ray of hope as the fears of the pandemic receded. But, much to our chagrin, the second wave unleashed itself with unimaginable fury, dashing our hopes of getting back to business.

As a result, maintenance of all the equipment and machinery, and preventing it from rusting and rotting was a huge challenge.

However, there was some welcome cause for cheer amid all the gloom as the KSCA could hold the KSCA Sports Centre AGM and Elections to the Executive Committee in March 2021.

Work for the above events began in right earnest with each of our elected Executive Committee members assigned specific responsibilities for different sections of the KSCA Sports Centre.

The Chairmen of various Sub-Committees took a lot of initiatives to improve the functioning of their sections. Revenue and Capital budgets were prepared with due diligence.

The office bearers of the KSCA were fully supportive of the Executive Committee and encouraged all its members to take active interest in improving the facilities.

Some of the many initiatives taken during the pandemic and thereafter are summarised below:

(a) Maintenance of KSCA Sports Centre and the stadium premises during the pandemic was not compromised. Arrangements were made for all security personnel to stay inside the stadium to avoid curfew restrictions and keep the stadium secured. Special passes were made for employees on essential duties. All security personnel, grounds-men and essential staff worked beyond the call of their duty to ensure that every facility in the Sports Centre as well as at the cricketing arena was kept functional and serviceable.

(b) Timely salary payments were made to all the Sports Centre employees during the lockdown despite the closure of most of the facilities. Special efforts were made for employees to attend essential duties but many workers could not due to the absence of public transportation and strict curfew norms.

(c) The gymnasium, library and other recreation sections of the Sports Centre were re-opened as per strict guidelines. The beverage and catering services also resumed as the situation improved.

(d) The cover charges were waived during the full closure of Sports Centre facilities. Cover charges were also waived for Jan-Feb 2021 as the Sports Centre was closed due to the erection of the new Unipole Floodlight Towers and again for May-June 2021 when the Sports Centre was closed due to lockdown restrictions.

(e) A COVID Vaccination Camp was held exclusively for KSCA members in cooperation with Apollo Hospitals. All areas were fumigated and sanitised twice a day, sanitation stands were placed at prominent areas and temperatures of everyone involved monitored at regular intervals.

At the KSCA AGM in October, 2019, setting up of Sports Centres at Alur, Hubballi and Belagavi had been discussed. The Managing Committee is now placing the above Agenda before Members seeking their approval for:

- Formation of New Sports Centres at Alur, Hubli, and Belgaum as Sub-Committees, in the name and style of “KSCA Alur Sports Centre”, “KSCA Hubli Sports Centre and ‘KSCA Belgaum Sports Centre’ respectively to carry out the objects of the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA);
- Bye-laws of the aforementioned New Sports Centres.

The Managing Committee is recommending these pursuant to Rule 15 (B)(xx) and (xxi) of the Bye-Laws of the KSCA which provides for the powers of the Managing Committee “to run Sports Centres/s in the State of Karnataka for the promotion of Cricket and for the use of Members, Cricketers, Cricket fans and their families, developing various facilities thereon, in accordance with the Rules made thereon from time to time”. Further, under the said Rule, the Managing Committee shall have powers to recommend to the General Body from time to time, the Rules for the Sports Centres that are to be developed in various places in the state of Karnataka.

Pursuant to Rule 8(b)(vi) of the Bye-Laws of the KSCA, the Managing Committee, is placing the following resolutions before the Members for approval.

**“RESOLVED THAT** the consent of the Members be and is hereby accorded to the Managing Committee of the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA) for the formation of New Sports Centres at Alur, Hubli, and Belgaum as Sub-Committees, in the name and style of “KSCA Alur Sports Centre”, “KSCA Hubli Sports Centre and ‘KSCA Belgaum Sports Centre’ respectively to carry out the objects of the KSCA.”

**“RESOLVED FURTHER THAT** Bye-Laws of the New Sports Centres viz., ‘KSCA Alur Sports Centre’, ‘KSCA Alur Sports Centre’ and ‘KSCA Belgaum Sports Centre’, as tabled before the Members, be and are hereby approved and adopted.”

**“RESOLVED FURTHER THAT** the consent of the Members be and is hereby accorded to the Managing Committee of the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA) for inducting new ‘Individual Affiliates and Service Affiliates’ to the aforementioned New Sports Centres at a fee prescribed in the Bye-Laws of ‘KSCA Alur Sports Centre’, ‘KSCA Hubli Sports Centre’ and ‘KSCA Belgaum Sports Centre’.”

- b. Two persons appointed by the Managing Committee of KSCA.”

## Explanatory Note for Item No. 5(f) on Agenda

**To seek approval of the Members to authorise the Managing Committee to consider, based on expert legal /tax opinion, various alternative structures/ options concerning diversified operations of the Association and to take necessary steps to set up if required additional/ alternative entities to mitigate/ eliminate the legal and financial risks:**

Detailed explanatory note :

At the KSCA AGM in October, 2019, setting up of Sports Centres at Alur, Hubballi and Belagavi and also to take new Affiliates by charging admission fee had been discussed. At the AGM dated 31st January, 2021, the members had been informed that "regular interactions with the tax and the legal experts are being held. A clear picture is likely to emerge in a few days and the matter would be taken forward based on the recommendations of the experts".

The Managing Committee is now placing the above Agenda before Members and informing them that the Tax and Legal opinion have been sought on the possible ways of restructuring activities of KSCA to ring-fence it from various risks including denial of exemption under the Income Tax Act and the associated risks of cancellation of Registration already granted. The KSCA is exploring options suggested by the Legal and Tax Experts.

Accordingly, pursuant to Rule 8(b)(vi) of the Bye-Laws of the KSCA, the Managing Committee, is placing the following resolutions before the Members for their approval.

### **5(f)(i):**

#### **Approval for outsourcing / transferring certain activities of KSCA:**

## Explanatory Note for Item No. 5(g) on Agenda

### Agenda No.5(g):

#### To consider additional budget for completion of Hubli project.

Detailed explanatory note:

A budget of Rs.25.00 Crores was approved by the Special AGM on 18th August, 2014 for undertaking Civil works, Road works, PHE works, Electrical works etc. At that time, budget needed to take up work such as Kitchen, STP, balance Road development, sump, solar lights etc.was not included as such works were to be taken up after the completion of the main project.

The works related to budget already approved by the AGM is practically complete and all standard procedures have been followed in implementing the works. So far, an amount of around Rs.18.00 crores has been released towards the work done and the balance work amounting to around Rs.7.00 crores are in work- in- progress stage. To complete the project so that it can be put to use optimally, an additional budget of Rs.7.00 Crores would be necessary to undertake the kitchen works with equipment, STP, balance Road development, sump, solar lights etc, the details of which are provided in the tabular column below.
